THREE-HANDED CANASTA RULES (revised 8-11-16)

There are only a few differences between the regular Canasta Club rules and the 3-Handed rules.

- 1. You do **NOT** have a partner and you must go it alone.
- 2. In your original hand you deal out <u>15 CARDS</u> to each person instead of 13.
- 3. When it is your turn, <u>draw 2 CARDS</u> and discard one. If you forget and only draw one card, then discard, you have lost your chance for the 2nd card and the next player plays.
- 4. The <u>first person to meld</u> while not taking the stack gets to pick <u>4 CARDS</u> from the top of the deck after discarding.
- 5. The 2nd and 3rd persons to meld while not taking the stack gets to pick 3
 CARDS from the top of the deck after discarding.
- 6. Only **ONE CANASTA** is required to go out. Your 3's count as part of your base score. If you have no Canastas, the 3's count **AGAINST** you.
- 7. There are **NO PAIRHANDS** in this game.
- 8. <u>ACE'S and SEVENS</u> are treated like any other natural card. You may make canastas of Ace's and Sevens using up to <u>TWO</u> Wildcards (black/dirty canasta), or all naturals (red/natural canasta). No penalties for having more than three A's or 7's in your hand when someone goes out. You may discard these into an <u>EMPTY</u> tray. Try to think of A's and 7's as if they were a Jack, King, six, four, etc. card.
- 9. All other regular rules of the game apply.
